

Fund Overview

The WisdomTree U.S. LargeCap Dividend Fund seeks to track the investment results of dividend-paying large-cap companies in the U.S. equity market.

Formerly known as WisdomTree LargeCap Dividend Fund through June 29, 2017.

Index Description

The WisdomTree U.S. LargeCap Dividend Index is a fundamentally weighted index that measures the performance of the large-capitalization segment of the U.S. dividend-paying market. Prior to June 30, 2017, the WisdomTree U.S. LargeCap Dividend Index was named the WisdomTree LargeCap Dividend Index.
